Advice for dog walkers

This site is owned by the Norfolk Archaeological Trust. We welcome dog walkers - but we ask you to keep your dog under close control. Here are the reasons why:

Not everyone likes dogs: Small children, nervous dogs and people without dogs can be scared by uncontrolled dogs.

Protecting livestock: By law, you must keep your dog under effective control so that it does not scare or disturb farm animals or wildlife.

Protecting wildlife: A dog running through long grass may cause ground-nesting birds, such as skylarks, to leave their nest and abandon their chicks.

Clearing up after your dog: If your dog is not under close control it's more likely you won't see where it's pooped. Dog poo can cause disease in humans and livestock, and just isn't nice to walk in.





Guidelines

- Keep your dog on a lead
March 1 - July 31 to protect wildlife
- Keep your dog on a short lead
around livestock
- At all times make sure your dog is
under close control and in sight
- Don't let your dog approach other
dog walkers or pedestrians
uninvited
- Keep to paths and don't allow your
dog to run through long grass
- Please clear up after your dog
