What else do I need to know?

Caistor Roman Town is home to a wide range of protected wildlife. These are very sensitive to disturbance by dogs. Please ensure you remain on your lead throughout the year to help us look after them.

Many visitors enjoy exploring Caistor Roman Town. To ensure their perfect visit, we ask all dog owners to keep their dogs on leads. This creates a safe environment for everyone to enjoy.
